### EXCELLENT TEST RESULTS

We were delighted with our Key Stage 2 test results this year. Level 4 is the expected level for children at the end of Year 6 and 97% of our children achieved this level or above in English and 94% in mathematics. A very pleasing 63% of children achieved level 5 in mathematics, a level which they are not expected to achieve until secondary school. In the table to the left, the results in the shaded rows are the 2009 national results (the most recent available comparison) and the results in the clear rows are for the school.

At Key Stage 1, the children's progress is assessed by the teacher. Here again, we are pleased with the results. Level 2 is the expected level for children at the end of Key Stage 1 and once again, the results in the shaded rows are the 2009 national results (the most recent available comparison) and the results in the clear rows are for the school.

### **SCHOOL LUNCHESES - important!!**

**A reminder that all school lunches must be paid for in advance.**

**If you are entitled to free school lunches, please bring proof of eligibility into school on the first day of the new term, otherwise you will be charged.**

Surrey County Council does not allow us to extend credit for school lunches, so without payment we are unable to provide your child with a meal and will have to ring you up and ask you to bring in a packed lunch for them.

It really helps Mrs Lowe if you can make your payment online, but if you are unable to do so, we are happy to take a cheque on the first day back at school.

### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

If you are buying school uniform over the holidays, may I remind you that

- school shoes should have flat heels and have a strap or laces;
- cardigans are not allowed: both boys and girls should wear school sweatshirts;
- shorts should be knee length or shorter.

### **SCHOOL STATIONERY & EQUIPMENT**

Even before the end of term, the shops are full of their "Back to school" offers! For the infant classes and year 3, we supply all the pens and pencils etc. that your child needs, so there is no need to succumb to all those special offers!

**Please do not send in your child with a pencil case or other stationery items to infant classes and Year 3.**

In Years 4, 5 and 6, we encourage the children to develop the ability to look after their own equipment themselves and have it ready for each lesson. If your child is in these year groups, this is what they need to bring with them to school:

*Pencil case (small enough to fit into their tray), spare Berol handwriting pen in black, spare HB pencil, small 15 cm ruler, 1 highlighter pen, rubber, barrel pencil sharpener and (optional) colouring pencils.*

**Please do not send in felt tip pens, gel pens, compasses, protractors, calculators, etc.**

We supply all the junior children with a new pen and pencil each half term. If they lose or break them, it is their responsibility to replace them. As during this year, replacement pens and pencils will be available at cost from the school shop, which opens every Friday lunchtime.

The shop also offers a small range of other stationary items, such as pencil cases, glue sticks, rulers, pencil sharpeners, etc. at well below shop prices.

### **EARRINGS and JEWELLERY**

The very strict guidelines issued by Surrey County Council do not permit children wearing earrings to take part in any PE or swimming activities. This means that during the first six weeks after a child's ears have been pierced, when previously children had been allowed to put tape over their earrings, the guidance now says that they cannot take part in PE or swimming lessons at all.

So, if you are considering having your child's ears pierced, please have this carried out at the beginning of the summer holiday, so that by the time they return to school they are able to take part in PE lessons.

Children must be able to remove and/or replace their own earrings.
